Strategy #1: Look, Say, Cover, Write, Check	Strategy #1: Find the Smaller Words Inside

Strategy #13: Blue Vowels-Red Consonants Write each of your spelling words in pencil. Then, use a crayon, colored pencil, or marker and trace all of the vowels in blue and the consonants in red.	Strategy #14: Three Times First, write each spelling word in pencil. Then write each spelling word in crayon or colored pencil. Finally, write each spelling word in pencil or marker.

Strategy #15: Acrostic Poem	Strategy #16: Multiplying Your Words
Choose 8 of your most difficult spelling words and make an acrostic poem for each of the 8 chosen words. Example: Fly Fun in the sun Laps around clouds Yay! I'm free!	Write each of your spelling words once. Give consonants a value of 1-10 and vowels a value of 2. Then, figure out the "worth" of each word. Example: consonants = 5 vowels = 2 learn = 5 x 2 x 2 x 5 x 5 = 500

Write a riddle for each of your spelling words. Write the answer (a spelling word) underneath the riddle. Example: I come at the end of a letter write before you sign your name. What am I?	Write each of your spelling words with dotted letters. Then, connect the dots. Example: Somewhere
Strategy #10: Code Words	Strategy #20: Magazine Words
Assign a shape for each letter of the alphabet and then use those shape codes to "spell" your spelling words. Please write your actual spelling words next to the code words. Example: a = b = c = c	Strategy #20: Magazine Words Write each of you spelling words once. Then, with parent permission, go through and old magazine and cut out letters to form each word.
Strategy #21: Telephone Words	Strategy #22: Wordsearch
Write each of your spelling words in pencil. Then, look at a telephone keypad and translate the letters into the numbers that share the same button.
